With the pandemic finally in our rear view mirror, The Arc Southern Maryland would like to thank our staff, families and community partners for their enduring support over the last two and half years. Our front-line staff and nursing team worked in concert to ensure everyone's safety while we collectively focused on minimizing the pandemic's impact on the people we support.

A new year brought with it some new opportunities as well as challenges. The Arc continued to combat the pervasive staffing shortage which plagues our industry. We engaged targeted recruitment efforts and new marketing channels to build up our talented work force and created a new employee focused committee and incentive-based credentialed training for front line staff which have positively impacted retention.

2022 was also marked by growth. Our Charles County office was bursting at the seams and so a new building was purchased in Waldorf that allows enough space for all existing programs and services as well as some expansion. As we move into 2023, plans are already underway to build out a commercial grade teaching kitchen where people we support will learn hands on culinary skills in a professional environment, thanks to grants from both The TJX and Maria Grazia Panero Foundations. A tech lab will also be installed in the new office thanks to a grant from The Charles County Charitable Trust. Both of these new resources will provide training and marketable job skills for our individuals. Our new space will also house a laundry facility which will be used in conjunction with our kitchen to provide life skills practice and training.

In 2022 we continued to prioritize efforts where The Arc could work in collaborative partnerships with community resources and local governments. An example of this is our Wheels 2 Wellness program which expanded into Charles County. The program transports elderly and/or disabled persons to their non-emergency medical appointments when they don't have another means of transportation. Every dollar spent on this transportation saves five dollars in healthcare costs according to the state's financial performance system. We are thankful to be an integral part of this program.

The Arc also began working closely with the State's Aging Authority and Tri County governments to develop services which would allow seniors to stay in their own homes. A task force made up of citizens from the three counties was established for this project.

We were recognized as The Calvert County Chamber's Non-Profit of the Year for 2022. We are honored by the award especially because the county has so many worthy non-profit organizations focused on improving quality of life for county residents.

Thank you again for joining our journey in 2022. Please enjoy the highlights featured in our annual report and we look forward to a bright future for The Arc Southern Maryland in 2023.




Maintaining so many homes requires the hard work of our excellent maintenance team and funding from our community partners.


